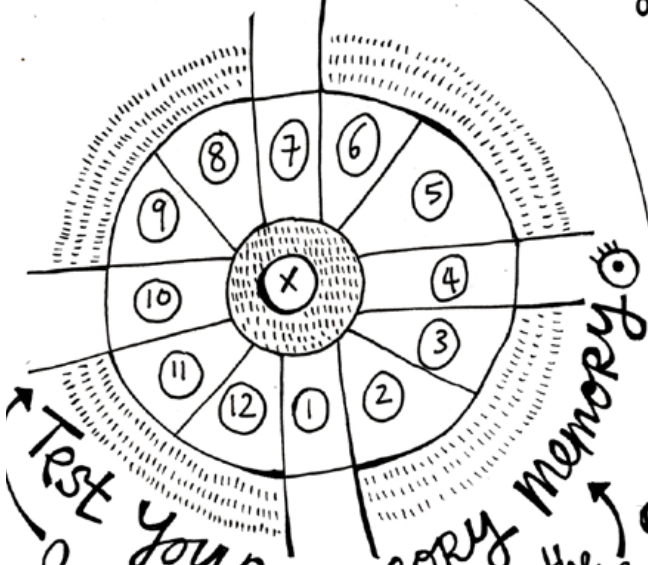


# FISHPOUNDS PARK

- What does the statue in the middle of the park commemorate?

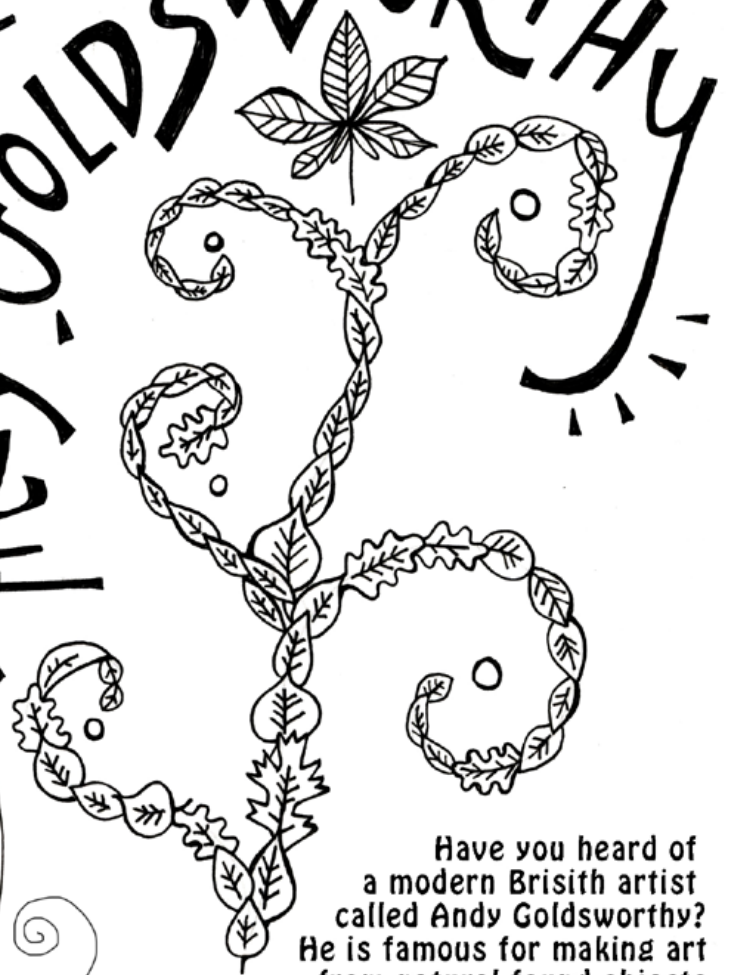


**Test your sensory memory**

Walk around the park and collect natural objects that you find... think of interesting colours and shapes that you could use.
