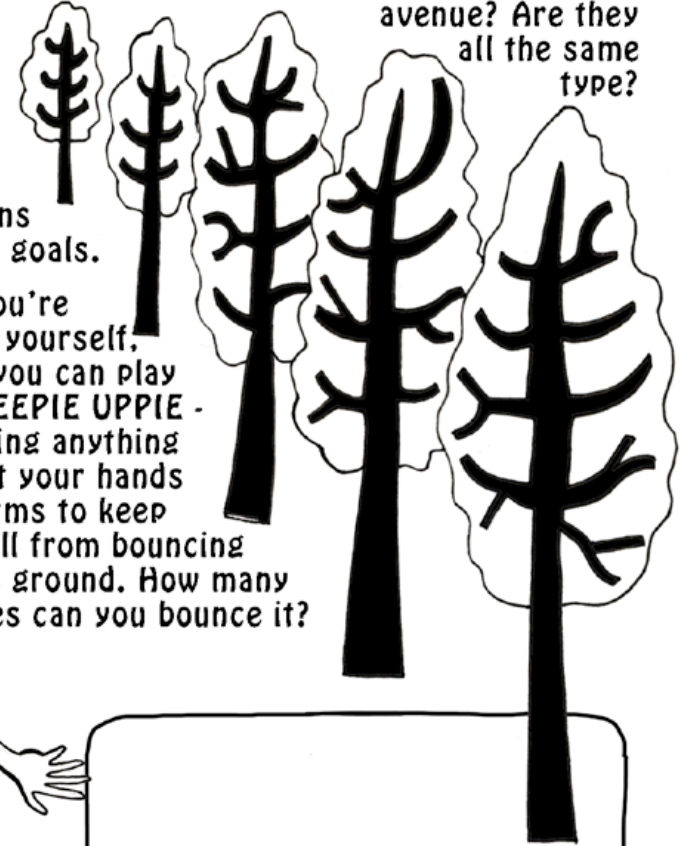
A HORSE CHESTNUT LEAF?

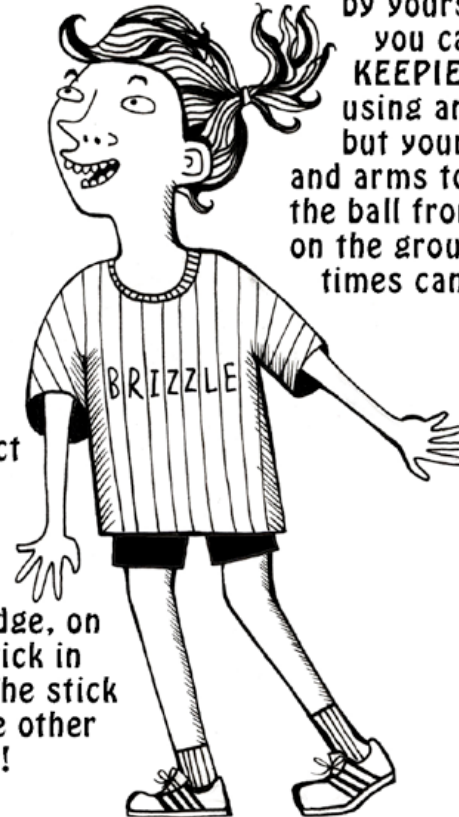
CONHAM RIVER PARK
