Make sure they're not rare species. Keep them tucked in a heavy book. They can be used to make beautiful greeting cards!



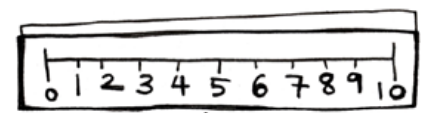

MAKE A BARK RUBBING

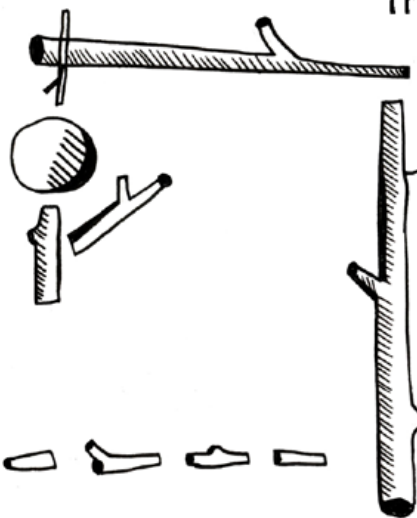
